



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Macon County Schools

The Macon County School District is located in Tuskegee, AL and includes seven schools that serve nearly 2,800 students in grades PK through 12. The school district is governed by the Superintendent of Education and five board members. The school district is surrounded by numerous resources to include Tuskegee University, the Tuskegee Airmen Museum, the Tuskegee National Forest, the birthplace of Rosa Parks, and the Tuskegee Multicultural Center.

The Macon County School District is committed to academic excellence and spends \$8,299 per pupil in current expenditures. The district spends 53% on instruction, 39% on support services, and 8% on other elementary and secondary expenditures.

The Macon County School District has 15 students for every full-time equivalent teacher, with the AL state average being 18 students per full-time equivalent teacher.

The Macon County School District is proud to have a high school graduation rate of over 90%. Several stellar programs support the attainment of a positive graduation rate: The Second Chance Program, Credit Recovery, Course Recovery, and the Star Academy.

In the Macon County School District, 12% of students have an IEP (Individualized Education Program). An IEP is a written plan for students eligible for special needs services. Gifted services are provided through consultative services.

Every student from the Macon County School System will graduate from high school and pursue a choice for success (military, college, and entrepreneurship, job readiness) to further their interests, careers, and reach their goals.

It's Mission.....

The Macon County Public School System exists to provide a fair and appropriate education for all students in Macon County. We affirm five areas (goals) as a means of doing so: High student achievement, safe and secure learning environment, professional work force, partnerships, and effective use of district funds.

Accomplishments:

Dr. Frank has been the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Director for a total of 12 years and an educator for more than 25 years. Under her leadership, the Macon County Career and Technical Education Center was opened in August 2013 which included Automotive Servicing and Animal Science as new programs. Signed articulation agreements with both H. Councill Trenholm State Technical College and Southern Union Community College have been strengthened under Dr. Frank's guidance. She has held the position of Director, Federal Programs since July 2012, while maintaining the position Director, Career and Technical Education. In the past she has held the position of COordinator of CTE. In the past two years, the CTE Programs of Macon County have expanded to include both Robotics/Engineering and Health Science Education Programs. Health Science is being implemented as a result of Region VIII Workforce data and Kuder 'Navigation' surveys.

After accepting this career appointment and with a little over a decade of P-12 experience I chose first to survey the instructional programs and outcomes of the students in Macon County relative to Career & Technical Education. From my analysis I determined that there was a need to stabilize the student's career clusters, and that there was a need to offer more opportunities for growth and development within these career paths to include adding new programs. In short, there was a need to provide extensive professional development opportunities for staff.

My past educational experiences have been Classroom Teacher, Reading Coach, Tutor Teacher, Asst. Band Director, Gifted Educator, Asst. Principal for Curriculum & Instruction, and School Improvement Specialist for Academic Improvement Programs. I have also served as an Adjunct

Instructor, and Guest Presenter at Faulkner University and Alabama State University 2006-2009. Lastly, I have written educational grants in excess of \$350,000.00 per an academic year.

Accomplishments:

For the academic year 2012/2013 three of our service programs received a renewed BIC (Business Industry Certification) without recommendations. They were: Business Education – Booker T. Washington High School, Cosmetology – Career and Technical Education Center, and Business Technology – Tuskegee Institute Middle School.

We also made great efforts towards securing program readiness for our Automotive Services Technology program to become NATEF Certified for the academic year 2013/2014. Our site visit is scheduled for early September 2013.

We were able to successfully dual enrollment 26 high school students at Trenholm State Technical College for Summer Classes 2013. This was the first ever of this type of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Initiative and Collaboration. As a continuation, we have 42 dual enrollment high school students at Trenholm State Technical College for the Fall 2013 academic year.

Our programs also expanded in terms of global readiness opportunities by offering a

WIA (Workforce Improvement Act) Program for eligible participants. The CTE Staff has worked all year to qualify students for this program. Participants will benefit from the many areas of this program: *EverFI Financial Literacy, Math/Reading Tutorials, Career Counseling, Drop by Drop, Harassment Is, Safety Orientation, and Workplace Behaviors.* All of the curriculum components are offered to each program participant. This is an ADECA Grant Award Initiative.

Up and coming is a New Health Sciences Program which will join our existing programs. We are so pleased to be able to meet the needs projected from our workforce data. This program will prepare students for careers in Allied Health.

Lastly, we will now be able to offer students in our school system's CTC program Career Coaching services. We will be afforded the support of personnel assigned to our county who will work towards improving the affective domain needs of our students within their areas of chosen interest.

As you can see we are doing great things in the Macon County Public School System. Our teachers are dedicated to the mission of educating students. Please take a look at all that we offer on a daily basis. I am sure you will be amazed at what 9 programs, 12 educators, 4 locations, and 2 administrators are able to do in this community.



Accomplishments:

For the academic year 2012/2013 the Agriscience program offered AgriConstruction and Welding Technology classes. The Agriscience Department and FFA Organization participated in leadership workshops, working with the local 4-H club, various community projects and activities. Students had an opportunity to visit technical schools, colleges and universities to aid in making a decision for their ongoing education goals. Students had an opportunity to explore construction and/or welding careers, completed SAE's that were relative to their career goal or interest and gained experiences with basic construction and/or welding procedures. Students also had an opportunity to gain basic CNC Laser Robotics training, CAD Design with CNC Laser and Trotec software, certificates from Today's Class online program, Hunter Education Certificates and a Completer certificate in AgriConstruction and/or Welding.

For the upcoming 2013/14 academic school year, the Agriscience program will offer Construction Framing, Construction Finishing, Introduction to Metal Fabrication and Metal Inert Gas which will include CNC Laser training and Trotec design software. Students that enroll in my class have an opportunity for dual enrollment with Trenholm State Technical College or Southern Union Community College. Upon completion of required standards, students will have an opportunity to OSHA 10HR certificates, NCCER credentialing and Completer certificates.

Accomplishments

During the 2013 spring semester, students in Family and Consumer Sciences had the opportunity to work with Relationship Smarts Plus. This project engaged students to write a skit regarding a topic on relationships and one that would coincide with information that had been previously taught through Relationship Smarts Plus in the classroom. The students were broken into groups and assigned a project team member to help with brainstorming. After the skit was created and parts were assigned, students were asked to "audition". These audition tapes were then reviewed by project managers and principal investigators on the project for determination of the best suitable skit to be filmed for final production. Once we announced the chosen skit, the actors made additional efforts to edit the script to be more cohesive for a positive message to young people. They practiced for several weeks and were assisted by Mario Lightfoote, a Producer and Director in video and television for the Alabama Cooperative Extension System. This video was added to the curriculum regarding healthy and unhealthy relationships. The video provided a scenario of boundary setting in a teen relationship. The video highlights a situation where many young people find themselves when beginning to engage in romantic relationships and the power of choice. The video is called "Don't Bet on It". We are then able to engage the students in a discussion with several follow-up questions about the different approaches to building relationships as they have seen in the video.
